## Fiscal Report for 2009 Rodeo and Related Events

During the summer of 2009, the Pecos Valley Cowboy Church hosted several events that were attended by the general public. Among these events were a rodeo on July 4 & 5, a rodeo on August 15 & 16, a July 4<sup>th</sup> parade and fireworks display and a youth dance on August 15. The parade, fireworks display and youth dance were all free. On July 4<sup>th</sup>, we offered a 50% discount for entry of all Military veterans who attended the rodeo. All events were well attended and we appreciate the support from sponsors, spectators and the community at large.

The rodeos were geared toward a wholesome, family atmosphere and the rodeo events were available to anyone. Many events did not require livestock and many were for participants that do not own a rope or dogging horse. Also, alcohol was not allowed on the property for any of the above mentioned events. One of our goals was to bring an event to the village that locals and families would enjoy in particular. Based on our view, the rodeos, parade, fireworks and dance were all very well received by the community.

In an effort to keep all informed regarding the income raised from the above mentioned events, the church leadership has asked the rodeo team to make this report available to the public. Below are the income, expenses and our plan for the use of the profit.

Here are some highlights:

- The rodeo organization team consisted of ten people.
- We had 42 sponsors.
- Over 2600 volunteer man hours went into putting on this event.
- About 80 people volunteered their time in some way, some church members, many not.

Gross profit was derived from sponsors, gate, concession and vendors.

Gross profit: \$19,620.40

Expenses were for concession items, supplies, buckles, added money for rodeo events, banners, queen and princess supplies, permits, advertising and printing.

Expenses: \$17,093.82

Net Profit: \$2,526.58

Of this net profit, the rodeo team will donate \$500.00 to the Pecos Schools for school supplies, and \$500.00 to the Pecos Valley Medical Center. The remaining \$1,526.58 will go into the church building fund.
